

- Shutting down the job and cleaning up.





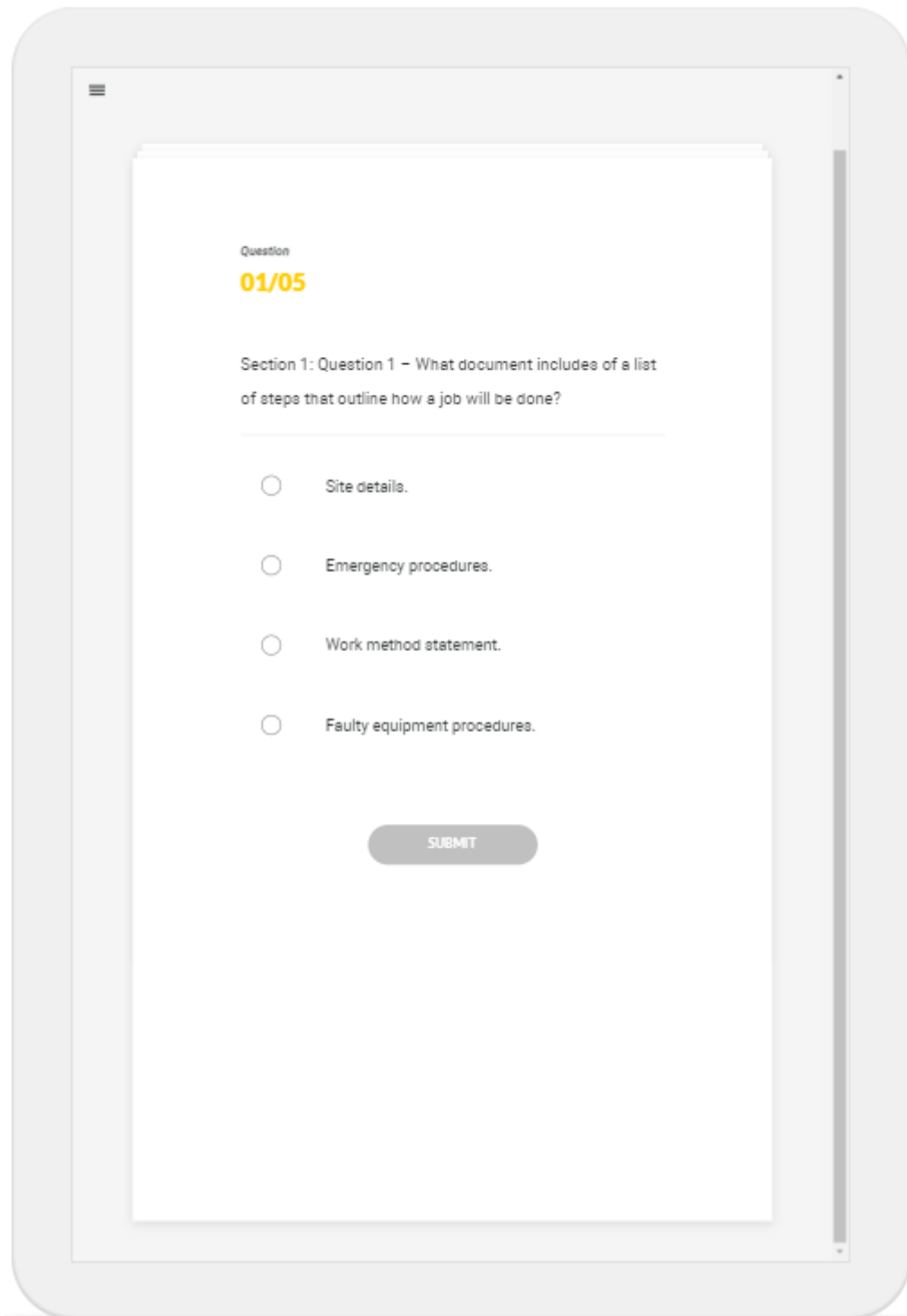
