

In some organisations permits are known as 'clearances'.





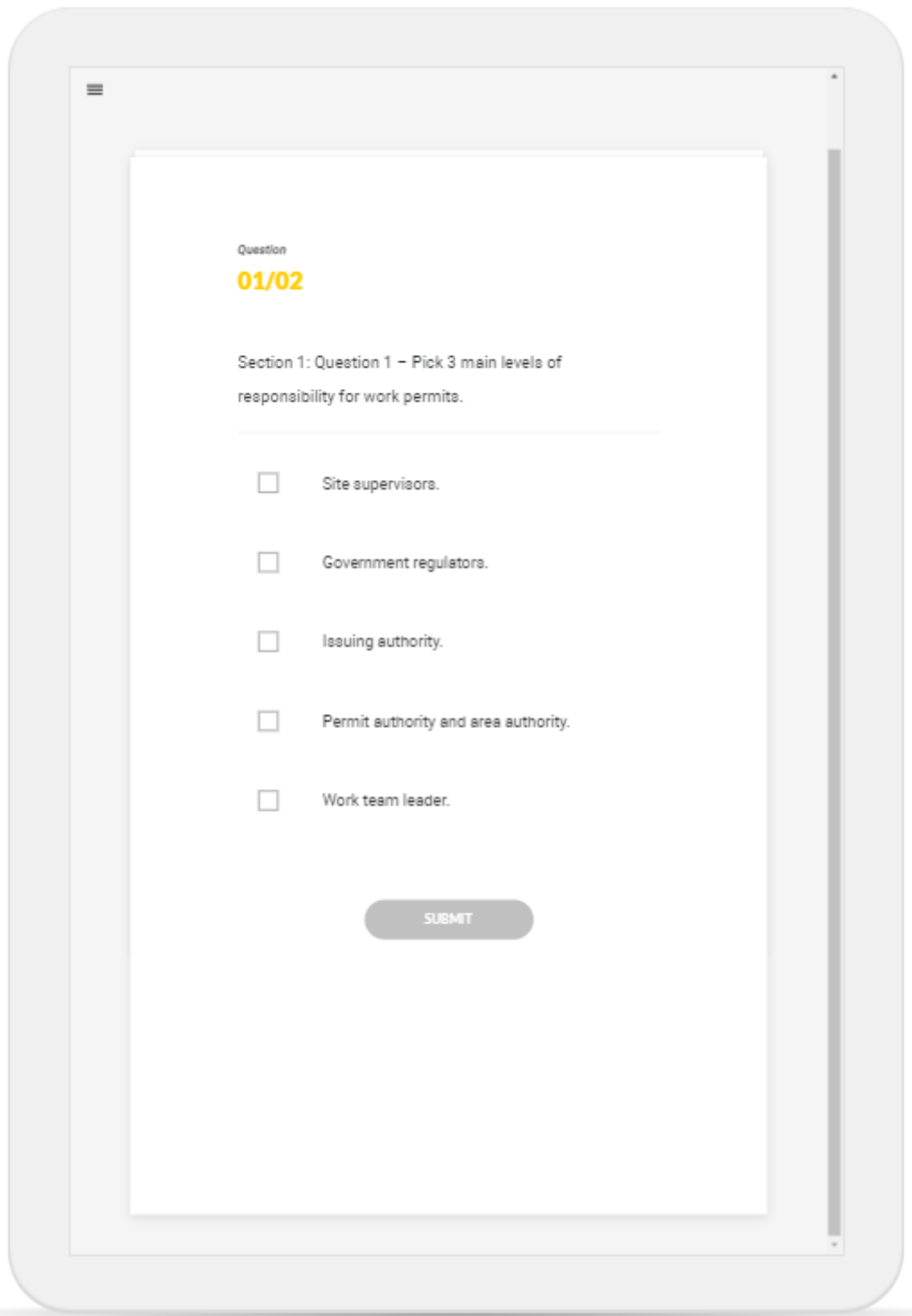
